Why roof tiles offer such creative license

The creative freedom of roof tiles is owed to the materials they are made from along with the contributions of the craftsmen who shape them.

Terracotta roof tiles are made from terracotta clay, a natural resource that comes in a variety of colours from the traditional sunburst orange, to pale whites and charcoal blacks and in between. Terracotta roof tile manufacture is one of the few industries where humans still play a large role in addition to machines.

Concrete roof tiles are made from a mixture of cement, water and sand and are available in a range of at least 18 different colours, including both plain and mottled. Because the colouring of a concrete tile is either integrally bonded with the body of the tile, or it is 'through-colour' with the entire body of the tile being coloured, there is no risk of peeling or delamination of the coloured surface.

The colour choices inherent in both terracotta and concrete roof tiles are further consolidated by their amazing selection of tile types to suit both classic and contemporary styles of architecture.



Most popular Australian Architecture Styles

Many distinct roofing trends have emerged across history that have changed the traditional rules of design allowing for new and exciting innovations, these include:

- Victorian (High pitches with interlocking tiles)
- Workers Cottage (Steel roof sheeting with front porch overhang)
- Queenslanders (Gabled roofs of corrugated iron with steep pitch)
- Postwar- triple-fronted brick veneer (Gable tile roof and distinct brick walls)
- Modern (Low pitches with flat square tiles)=

TERRACOTTA ROOF TILE COLOURS

Terracotta roofing tiles are commonly known for their bright orange colour, surprisingly they offer a wide variety of colour options including:

- Orange
- Red
- Brown
- Grey
- Black
- Cream White

CONCRETE ROOF TILE COLOURS

While concrete tiles do not offer as wide a range of shading options as terracotta, they still boast unlimited design capabilities.

- Black
- Grey
- Brown
- Cream White
- Orange
- Red

No hazardous chemicals are applied to roof tiles in order to achieve their colourings. However if coatings or paints are applied after installation, then it is best practice to enquire with the contractor as to their toxicity and what it can mean for your water tank.



Roof Tile Types

Roof tiles come in a variety of different shapes, colours and types. In this guide, we will cover a large portion of them.

FLAT TERRACOTTA ROOF TILES

Terracotta Shingle: An elegant tile with a flat shape that can be utilised for both classic and contemporary projects.

SHAPED TERRACOTTA ROOF TILES

French Terracotta: Identified by the two distinct valleys imparted into the design. French terracotta tiles are a staple of the Federation style of architecture and are ideal for classic designs.

Swiss: Defined by their unique humps, Swiss tiles are a staple of Mediterranean and Modern architecture styles.

FLAT CONCRETE ROOF TILES

Flat Shingle: A strong tile with a versatile shape that can be utilised for a wide spread of project types.

Flat Interlocking Roof Tile: Like flat concrete shingles, flat interlocking tiles are highly versatile and can be fitted to both classic and contemporary styles.

SHAPED CONCRETE ROOF TILES

Curved Roof Tiles: Possessing a distinct S shape profile, these tiles are optimal for classic projects.

Spanish: Primarily utilised for the Spanish revival style, these interlocking tiles possess a very distinct hump.



Updating your roof without a replacement

It is understandable that after a few decades of enjoyment, you might want to update the aesthetic of your roof. This is very much possible and you don't need to opt for a full roof replacement to do it.

In order to undergo the colour changing process your roof needs to be in good condition and cleared of all debris, mould, mildew or other problems. Once the roof is clean, the changing of the colour process can be completed over several days.

High acrylic roof coating products are made specifically to change the colour of roof tiles and can be made to match any shade.

Quick Terminology Guide

Coating: A liquid coating applied to a roof to improve lustre.

Glaze: A substance applied to terracotta roof tiles to provide an impervious colour finish.

Pigment: A substance used for colouring, usually a powder.

Pitch: The angle of the roof in terms of degrees.

Profile: The specific shape of a roof tile.
